



PMT Pays Customers \$399,361

Rupert, ID – \$ 399,361 was approved by Project Mutual Telephone’s (PMT’s) Board of Directors to be paid to member customers in patronage dividends this year, the largest amount in the history of the 91-year-old cooperative.

“We are very proud to be able to return this money to our members. We are the only communication company in the area who pays customers back,” says PMT Board Chairman Pat Merrigan. “Paying customers patronage is a tangible way to say ‘thanks for doing business locally’ because without our members, we don’t exist.”

The dividend each customer receives depends on the amount of business they have done with the cooperative. The more PMT services used by each member, the larger the patronage check. This year’s dividend payment will be issued in December, and represents patronage earned in 1991 and 2006.

Checks will be mailed the first of December. For those members receiving dividends in the amount of ten dollars or less, the credit will be applied to their December bill.
